Raise.me is a platform in "microscholarships" that's essentially changing the game of college aid. Yes, it's legitimate, and yes, you should create an account. As you enter coursework, grades, clubs, etc. certain colleges will provide a monetary award for each entry indicating the extra funds you'll receive if you attend the offering school (e.g. FIU, Penn State, UMass, Tulane, Stetson). More institutions join this effort regularly- try it out.

Bright Futures Scholarship program offered by the state of Florida, among other programs. It is strictly merit-based, so no financial need is even part of the requirements, only course schedules (covered at TERRA, bam!), GPA, SERVICE HOURS

Cappex Easy Money Scholarship

Cappex is a very generous provider of college scholarships for high school and college students, offering recurring awards each month. In addition to offering scholarships, Cappex also has some really useful tools for navigating the college admissions process. After all, their slogan is the "college search made simple." Eligibility: students must be enrolled or planning to enroll in school in the next calendar year. This includes college/university students,

community college students, and those pursuing online degrees. Transcripts and GPAs are not considered (nor are recommendations or essays for that matter) for the \$1,000 Cappex Easy College Money Scholarship, only entry. **Award: \$1,000**

College Board Opportunity Scholarships (CLASS OF 2024 and 2025, DO THIS!)

Applying to college is a complicated process, so The College Board has created a program that guides you through it. It doesn't require an essay, application, or minimum GPA. Instead, it rewards your effort and initiative. Complete key steps along your path to college for a chance to earn scholarships. The more effort you put in, the more opportunities you have to earn a scholarship. Complete all six, and you're eligible to earn \$40,000. Scholarships will be awarded through monthly drawings to students who complete each action. Eligibility: The College Board Opportunity Scholarships program is open to all class of 2024 students in the United States, Puerto Rico and the US territories. Students in the class of 2025 will be eligible next year. This program is open to students regardless of their family income. At least half of all the scholarships (over \$2 million) will be designated for students whose families earn less than \$60,000 per year.

Award: up to \$40,000

Scholarships and grants available test dates and deadline dates (some listed on the website and others will be listed on the school website and other places).

MDC, American Dream:

- You must earn a standard high school diploma, GED, or home school diploma in Miami Dade County.
- You must currently reside in Miami Dade County.
- You must be entering college for the first time or be a graduating dual enrollee.
- You must have a cumulative high school weighted GPA of 3.00 or above.
- You must be admitted to MDC and registered for 12 or more credits for the Fall 2020 semester.
- You must complete the 2020-2021 FAFSA, you don't need to be eligible for federal financial aid, but you must complete the FAFSA application.
- You must prove college readiness by meeting one of two criteria:
 - Achieve minimum test scores on approved standardized tests. Any combination of the highest available scores are used in determining your readiness in a skill area. Scores within a two-year period of the test date are considered valid for eligibility purposes. Expired scores will not be used.
 - Have a cumulative high school weighted GPA of 3.5 or greater.

FIU Academic Scholarships:

- **Presidential Premier** Students with 4.0 GPA and 1370 SAT / or 30 ACT. Awards 100% tuition and fees plus a book stipend.
- Ambassador Premier Students with 4.0 GPA and 1280 SAT or 27 ACT. Awards 75% tuition and fees plus a book stipend.
- National Merit Students who qualify for Presidential/Ambassador scholarships and are selected as a finalist. Awards full tuition, fees, room and board, up to the cost of attendance as published by the Office of Student Financials.
- National Hispanic Students who qualify for Presidential/Ambassador scholarships and are selected as a finalist. Awards full tuition, fees, room and board, up to the cost of attendance as published by the Office of Student Financials.

 - Be a newly admitted FIU first year student
 - Meet academic eligibility listed above
 - Submit 2 letters of recommendation
 - Write an essay response to a prompt

- Pegasus Scholarships are awarded to entering students by <u>Undergraduate Admissions</u> to recognize outstanding academic performance. There is no separate application for this scholarship program. Students who apply for admission to UCF for summer or fall terms are automatically considered.
- FAFSA must be turned in by June 1 each year

• Students must enroll in a minimum of 12 UCF credit hours to be eligible and/ or continue to receive the scholarships listed above.

UF Academic Scholarships:

- Presidential Scholarship: \$5,000 per year (Fall/Spring, total 20,000 over 4 years)
- Presidential Gold Scholarship: \$8,000 per year (Fall/ Spring, total \$32,000 over 4 years)
- Presidential Platinum Scholarship: \$10,000 per year (Fall/ Spring, total 40,000 over 4 years)
- While there are no minimum academic criteria for Presidential scholarships, applicants must be classified as a Florida resident for tuition purposes by our February Decision Day. Past recipients have demonstrated strong academic achievement that falls within the upper range of our middle 50% of our admitted student profile or above, combined with a diverse and engaged resume and essay response. However, meeting our profile numbers does not guarantee a scholarship award. If selected for one of our merit-based scholarships, an offer will arrive via email by mid-March.

FSU Academic Scholarships:

- National Merit Finalist/Benacquisto Scholarship: This prestigious scholarship is available to National Merit Finalists that are graduating with a standard high school diploma. This award equals the institutional cost of attendance (minus the sum of Bright Futures and the National Merit scholarship). The total value of this scholarship is over \$80,000 over four years and guarantees admission into FSU's University Honors Program. Detailed information about this scholarship can be found here.
- Presidential Scholars Program: Accepted freshmen that have received the University Freshman Scholarship, the Benacquisto Scholarship, or a Tuition Reduction Scholarship are also eligible to apply for the Presidential Scholars Program. The Program application deadline is February 17, 2020. The total value of this scholarship is \$31,200 over four years. Out-of-state applicants will also receive a full out-of-state tuition waiver. - University Freshman Scholarship: The Office of Admissions will automatically consider accepted freshmen for our University Freshman Scholarship. A separate application is not required. Scholarships are competitive and awarded based on academic merit (combination of academic weighted grade point average AND test scores). The award is \$2,400 per year distributed over four years, for a total of \$9,600. Scholarship funds are limited, so students are encouraged to apply for admission by November 1 to be admitted in January for priority consideration. Scholarship awards will be made in January and continue until all available funds are exhausted. Scholarship recipients must take a minimum of 15 credit hours per semester and maintain a grade point average of 3.0 or higher at Florida State.

UM Academic Scholarships:

• The <u>Stamps Scholarship</u> is UM's most prestigious merit award available to students at the

University of Miami. This scholarship is awarded to exceptional and academically accomplished

high school seniors. Stamps Scholars receive the full cost of attendance for four years of

undergraduate study at UM. The award includes tuition and fees, on-campus housing, a meal plan,

University health insurance, textbooks, a laptop allowance, and access to a \$12,000 enrichment

fund which may be used toward study abroad, undergraduate research, unpaid internships, and

other educational purposes.

- Named after Nobel Prize-winning author and UM lecturer Isaac Bashevis Singer, <u>this prestigious</u> <u>scholarship</u> is awarded to exceptional and academically accomplished high school seniors. Singer Scholars receive the **full cost of tuition** for four years of undergraduate study at UM.
- Honoring the legacy of the University's first director of minority affairs, the <u>Ronald A. Hammond</u> <u>Scholarship</u>, is awarded to diverse high school seniors who have demonstrated academic excellence and who intend to continue their academic pursuits through graduate education. Hammond Scholars receive the **full cost of tuition** for four years of undergraduate study at UM.
- <u>The Weeks Scholarship</u> is awarded to exceptional and academically accomplished high school

seniors. Selected candidates for the Weeks Scholarship are prompted to submit an essay for consideration as finalists. The Selection Committee will review all essay submissions and identify the finalists whom they recommend to receive the Weeks Scholarship. Weeks Scholars receive the

full cost of tuition for four years of undergraduate study at UM.

• The Jenkins scholarship is awarded to high school seniors with strong academic credentials,

significant financial need, and a history of overcoming adversity. To be considered for this

scholarship, students must be nominated by their guidance counselor. Jenkins Scholars receive the

full cost of attendance for four years of undergraduate study at UM. The award includes tuition

and fees, on-campus housing, a meal plan, University health insurance, and a laptop allowance.

Students may also receive a stipend for books, transportation, and personal expenses.

• Scholarship recipients must complete a full-time undergraduate program of study with no fewer than 12 credit hours during each of the fall and spring semesters for a minimum of 24 credit hours per academic year. A minimum of a 3.0 GPA for the academic year must be maintained at the University of Miami, with the initial calculation at the end of the second semester of attendance. The award is subject to revision pending receipt of any grant, scholarship, or prepaid tuition and/or housing aid not anticipated at the time the award is made.
