PAPER SAT VS DIGITAL SAT

PAPER SAT

DIGITAL SAT

Availability

- Students in the U.S will be able to take the paper SAT through the Fall 2023 testing dates
- Testing done on paper

- The digital SAT test will be available to international students in 2023 and to U.S. students in 2024
- Students will be able to take the test on their own laptop or tablet

NOT CHANGING:

Students who require testing accommodations will continue to receive them. At-home testing will not be an option. The SAT will be administered exclusively at schools and testing centers

Structure

• **Static**- The test does not change based on a student's performance

• **Stage Adaptive**- The difficulty of a section's second stage is based on the performance in the first stage

Score Reports

- Available 2-3 weeks after the exam- student can order questions and answers for review
- Available days after the exam-Question and answers are no longer available

Test Length

- Total test time 3 hours and 15 minutes
- Reading and Writing section

100 minutes

Math section

80 minutes

- Total test time 2 hours and 14 minutes
- Reading and Writing section-

64 minutes

Math section

70 minutes

Reading and Writing

- Reading and writing separated into two sections
- Reading section contains 5 passages with **52 questions**
- Writing section contains 4 passages with 44 questions
- Reading and writing section combined
- Total section is **54 questions**, each includes a very short passage

Math

- Math broken down into calculator and no calculator section
- Calculator section contains 38 questions
- No Calculator section contains 20 questions
- Calculator is **OK** to use during entire math section.
- Entire math section contains 44 questions

NOT CHANGING

- The digital SAT will continue to measure the knowledge and skills that appear on the paper SAT
- Scoring will remain on the same 1600 scale.
